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Michal Škoda's previously unexhibited paintings are at Telegraph Gallery in Olomouc

Curator Silvia L. Čúzyová, in collaboration with the artist and Telegraph Gallery, are presenting the exhibition Topography of Solitude by Michal Škoda. The artist will present works created between 2020 and 2022 that have not been exhibited anywhere else before. The opening of the exhibition will take place on Thursday 25 May at 6 pm. It will be on public display at the Telegraph Gallery in Olomouc until 10 August.

Michal Škoda is known first and foremost as a sculptor, but the drawing and medium of the artists' book are also very important to him. For a long time, he has been devoted to painting also, more precisely to the image itself. Typically, he tries different approaches to painting and works with various materials. This time, however, the artist is "seduced" by the conventional format of painting on canvas. He abstractly and geometrically reflects and visualizes concepts such as relationships, delineations, and emptiness.

A word from the curator Silvia L. Čúzyová

One of the fundamental pillars of Škoda's painting is the transformation of one type of image into another. The artist creates precise compositions, choosing calm forms and colours without figuration and explicit narration. He specifically captures real environments and experiences, which nevertheless cannot be associated with a specific moment or place. He does not give his canvases names, but only numbers. Thanks to this, we can observe the materialisation of his ideas and the transformation of his painterly intentions over the course of time.

In short, we can say that Škoda's paintings have undergone a transformation from surprising colours and more personal content to a restrained geometric style in black, white, and shades of grey. Experience is reduced to an abstract form of geometric impression, through which the artist shares an enjoyment of precision, order, and harmony. The exhibition is also complemented by two recent sculptural objects that frame Škoda's collection of black objects.

MICHAL ŠKODA (1962), artist and curator, was born in Tábor. An autodidact who, in addition to his work, has also been the head of the Gallery of Contemporary Art and Architecture at the House of Art in České Budějovice since 1997, where he has managed to build a prestigious Central European gallery. He has had a long series of exhibitions, both at home and abroad. He is dedicated to contemporary art and architecture, but his interest in music, poetry, film, and contemporary dance also plays a large role in his work. The central themes of his work, "man and space", are treated in numerous drawings, paintings, objects, occasional site-specific installations, photographic records, artists' books, and diaries. Since 2019, he has been collaborating frequently with the Slovak curator Silvia L. Čúzyová on his solo exhibitions.

SILVIA L. ČÚZYOVÁ (1981), art historian and independent curator. She graduated from the Faculty of Arts at the University of Trnava with a Master's degree in History of Art and Culture and received her Ph.D. from the Department of Theory and History of Art at the Academy of Fine Arts in Bratislava. She also worked as the director of the Medium Gallery at the Academy of Fine Arts and was a member of the Research Centre there. Currently, she also lectures at Trnava University, and reviews, publishes and collaborates on art exhibitions both at home and abroad. She specializes in the history and theory of modern and contemporary visual art and in the history and present of art criticism. She is a member of the Slovak section of AICA (International Association of Art Critics).
