The Eighties at Olomouc's Telegraph Gallery: Signál IV Exhibition Unveils the Unofficial Czechoslovak Art Scene of the 1980s

The Telegraph Gallery presents its fourth exhibition showcasing the collection of Robert Runták, the founder of the Telegraph platform for art and creativity. The representative selection, Signál IV: The Eighties, explores the unofficial art scene of the 1980s, juxtaposing a generation of emerging artists with their mentors. Opened by a vernissage on 5 December, the exhibition features works by Milan Knížák, Adriena Šimotová, Jiří David, Tomáš Císařovský, Michael Rittstein, and others, and will remain on view until 20 March 2025.

Signál IV is the fourth exhibition to reveal another segment of Robert Runták's extensive collection, this time focusing on works from 1979–1991 in Czechoslovakia. For over a decade, Runták has been curating this collection to represent the unofficial art scene of that era. All exhibited pieces entered the collection at least two decades after their creation. "From today's perspective, it's remarkable that this exhibition, composed entirely of works from a single private collection, offers not just the collector's subjective viewpoint but also a broader insight into the Czech art scene of the 1980s," notes curator Pavla Kosař, who curated the exhibition alongside Miroslav Jiřele. Jiřele adds: "On the surface, the 1980s may seem invisible, with little happening in the official sphere. Yet beneath the surface, much was unfolding in private settings or within the handcrafted subcultures of the time. To me, the Eighties are 'visible/invisible' because of these contrasting perspectives."

The most dynamic elements of the contemporary art scene thus took place outside the official oversight of state-sanctioned evaluation committees, which were tasked with guaranteeing ideological and artistic conformity. The multifaceted, unofficial gallery network operated on the fringes: in private or alternative spaces and even in nature. The younger generation of artists developed their practices through short-term public exhibitions such as *Chmelnice* or *Konfrontace I–IV*, often under the watchful eye of the police. **The exhibition contrasts the generation of 1980s artists with their mentors, who operated outside institutional frameworks.** Behind the closed doors of their studios, these mentors filled the gap left by the lack of critical dialogue in art schools. "What emerged was a distinctly unique, visually rich decade—a time when artistic languages, approaches, concepts, and personalities collided, carrying ideas and visual culture from a distant past into the present," highlights **Jan Kudrna**, curator of Robert Runták's collection.

Signál IV: The Eighties showcases artists active during the 1980s across two main generational lines. The older generation of mentors, who had already been active in previous decades, is represented in Runták's collection—and therefore the exhibition—by figures such as Milan Knížák, Adriena Šimotová, Aleš Veselý, Alena Kučerová, and Jiří Načeradský. The younger generation of emerging artists is presented through works associated with the Tvrdohlaví group, including Jiří David and Jaroslav Róna, as well as other kindred spirits and individualists such as Václav Stratil, Vladimír Kokolia, Jiří Kovanda, Tomáš Císařovský, and Marian Palla.

Works by 38 artists are on display at the Olomouc Telegraph Gallery until 20 March 2025.


